The Royal Government of Bhutan has received financing from the World Bank for the implementation of the “Strengthening Risk Information for Disaster Resilience in Bhutan” Project and intends to apply part of this fund for this consulting service.

Under the Strengthening Risk Information for Disaster Resilience in Bhutan project, a fully functional Bhutan DRM Portal will be established. The consulting services (“the Services”) will entail the full operationalization of the Bhutan DRM Portal and building of the capacity of users. The estimated implementation period is ten months with an additional one year for operational support. The expected start date of the assignment is March/April 2024.

The Department of Local Governance & Disaster Management, Ministry of Home Affairs now invites eligible consulting firms (“Consultants”) to indicate their interest in providing the Services. Interested Consultants should provide information demonstrating that they have the required qualifications and relevant experience to perform the Services. The shortlisting criteria are: (i) General Experience of the consultant; (ii) Experience in similar assignments of compatible size, complexity and technical specialty in the required area including demonstratable track record or relevant project success, regional work experience and understanding; (iii) Technical and managerial capability of the firm including financial soundness, staffing and logistics. Key Experts will not be evaluated at the shortlisting stage.

The attention of interested Consultants is drawn to Section III, paragraphs, 3.14, 3.16, and 3.17 of the World Bank’s “Procurement Regulations for IPF Borrowers” Nov 2020 (“Procurement Regulations”), setting forth the World Bank’s policy on conflict of interest. In addition, please refer to the following specific information on conflict of interest related to this assignment as per paragraph 3.17 of the Procurement Regulations: *Consultants shall not be hired for any assignment that would be in conflict with their prior or current obligations to other clients, or that may place them in a position of being unable to carry out the assignment in the best interests of the Borrower.*

Consultants may associate with other firms to enhance their qualifications, but should indicate clearly whether the association is in the form of a joint venture and/or a sub-consultancy. In the case of a joint venture, all the partners in the joint venture shall be jointly and severally liable for the entire contract, if selected. In the case of an association (joint venture and/ or sub-consultant), all members should have real and well-defined inputs to the assignment, and the total number of firms including the associates will be limited to a maximum of 03 (Three).

A Consultant will be selected in accordance with the Quality and Cost-Based Selection Method set out in the Procurement Regulations.
